

Also in March PCHS provided a St. Patrick's Day Parade Toasting Station for the Pass St. Patrick's Day Parade. Members and friends enjoyed refreshments and games before watching the parade roll by.



Davis and Carl Brasseux talked about their book "Asian Cajun Fusion:Shrimp from the Bay to the Bayou". An interesting discussion related to our Gulf Coast shrimp industry and how important it has been to our culture and way of life.

In April Jerald Williams gave us the history and future plans of the Pass Christian Lighthouse Society. He took us through the history of this effort since before Katrina and current plans to rebuild the Pass Lighthouse as a city monument.





fired the first shot on Lexington Green on April 19,1775 to begin the American War for Independence. At the April lunch, Jeff Wallace gave an interesting talk about his book, "A Tale of Two Cannons-April 19, 1775", which creates an engaging historical work that is fascinating and intriguing.

At the May luncheon Brian Altobello spoke to his book, "Whiskey, Women and War: How the Great War Shaped Jim Crow New Orleans." It was a surprising and exciting history of New Orleans on the home front during World War I analyzing the mobilization of the local popula-



tion in terms of enlistments and war bond sales.

At the June luncheon, author Mike Bunn spoke about Mississippi history from 1798-1840. Bunn's latest book is "Old Southwest to Old South: Mississippi, 1798-1840." He explains how Mississippi's early development shaped the state and continues to define it today.
